Cambridge Primary & SD Regular Annual Spelling Bee

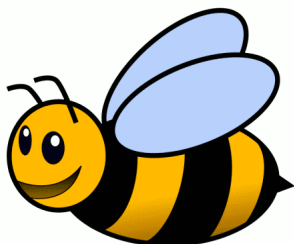

Looking Ahead to The Olympic Games - London 2012



The Olympic Games is a prestigious international event showcasing the world's best athletes. They are held every two years, alternating between summer and winter games, but both seasonal games occur every four years. The next Summer Olympics is to be held in London from 27 July to 12 August 2012. London is the only city to host the games three times, having previously done so in 1908 and 1978. The main Olympic stadium will fit 80,000 people, but the games will also be held at a variety of different venues including; Wembley Stadium, Wembley Arena, Wimbledon All England Club, The O2 Arena among others.

The organisers of the event have estimated approximately 8 million tickets will be available for the Olympic Games and 1.5 million for the Paralympic Games (for those with disabilities.) These tickets range from £20 to £2012, although certain events such as the marathon, triathlon and road cycling will be free. To date, some 3.5 million tickets have already been sold 850,000 people. There will be a total of 26 sports with 32 different disciplines. The 127 participating nations will have an estimated 10,500 athletes taking part in 302 different events. Since 14 March 2011 (500 days before the opening ceremony), a countdown had commenced on a digital OMEGA clock placed in Trafalgar Square, London. With less than a year to go, all sports enthusiasts are already in high spirits.
